Saints and Holy People of African Descent ~ The Martyrs of Uganda

In 1877 the first Church Missionary Society (CMS) missionaries arrived, representing the Church of England, followed two years later by the Roman Catholic White Fathers. The county (then called Buganda) was ruled by a powerful king, the Kabaka Mutesa, head of an elaborate political hierarchy. At first the Kabaka welcomed the missionaries, believing they would provide access to superior weaponry, but his initial interest soon changed when he realized their focus was on preaching the Gospel and founding schools. His paranoid son and successor, Mwanga, was distrustful of the Christians and ordered the murder of Bishop James Hannington and his companions as they entered Uganda in 1885. In the following year four young pages of the royal household went on a safari with a Scottish engineer who had attracted a following and they were ordered back to the royal capital where three of them had their arms cut off and were roasted alive, singing a Christian hymn as they died and as hundreds of people watched. As so often happens, the act of repression backfired. Hundreds of persons became interested in Christianity, and many sought baptism, sneaking in small groups to the missionary compounds by night. A Roman Catholic advisor and court favorite, Joseph Balikuddembe, was killed for protesting to the Kabaka about the murder of Bishop Hannington and the ruler's blatant sexual immorality with the young male pages. Repressions reached their height in 1886. One day as he was returning from an unsuccessful hunt, the Kabaka found groups of pages intently reading and discussing the Bible. Enraged, he ordered the youths to abandon their newly found faith or die. Most chose death, and on June 3rd, thirty-three of them, Roman Catholic and Anglican, were bound together in dry reed matting and placed over a slowly burning fire. The twenty-two Catholics who were martyred at this time were canonized by Pope Paul IV in 1964 as Charles Lwangaa & Companions.
