Saint Katharine Drexel, Founder, Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament & Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church

St. Katharine Drexel was a remarkable and brave Christian who was led by her faith to serve African American and Indian people at a time when this was a very unpopular thing to do. St. Katherine was born on November 26, 1858, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and she died on March 3, 1955. St. Katherine was born into a very wealthy family and she inherited a large fortune which she used to bring education and Catholicism to "Indian and Colored" people in this country. The impact of St. Katharine's belief in social justice for all is evident today in the many schools and churches she founded that are still operating. Our very own church is a living testament to the powerful impact of St. Katharine's fight for social justice. St. Katharine provided the financial support for the building of Our Lady of Lourdes and also provided financial support and faculty (SBS nuns) to Our Lady of Lourdes School. Founded in 1912, Our Lady of Lourdes is still standing strong and growing 100 years after its opening! In the state of Georgia, St. Katharine also founded St. Peter Claver school in Macon in 1915.

On her feast day (March 3rd) let us remember and celebrate the courageous men and women who did what was right when it was unpopular or safe during that time. St. Katharine opened many schools and missions for Black and Native Americans. She led a life devoted to uplifting the minds and spirits of Native and African American women, men and children. Founding and staffing schools throughout the country became a priority for Mother Katharine and her congregation of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament.

During her lifetime, she opened, staffed and directly supported over 70 schools and missions in the United States. In 1917 a school to prepare teachers was established in New Orleans, LA. This school became Xavier University of Louisiana in 1925, the only predominantly Black Catholic institution of higher learning in the United States.

St. Katharine was canonized in 2000 by Pope John Paul II, becoming the second US born saint. We can proudly honor and thank St. Katharine for her role in establishing our beloved Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Church Community.

March Is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month Colorectal cancer is cancer of the colon or rectum. It's as common in women as it is in men. This year, over 143,360 people will be diagnosed with colorectal cancer and an estimated 51,690 will die of the disease. With certain types of screening, this cancer can be prevented by removing polyps (grape-like growths on the wall of the intestine) before they become cancerous. Several screening tests detect colorectal cancer early, when it can be more easily and successfully treated. Prevention of this disease includes: maintaining a healthy diet, smoking cessation, limiting alcohol consumption, eating fruits, vegetables and whole grains, eating less red meat and eliminating processed meat.
