JUNK MAIL

Thanks in part to radio personality Michael Baisden, a 98-year-old woman named Mary Tony has become an Internet celebrity. On his website, Baisden featured a short video on the daily life of the elderly Pennsylvania resident, highlighted by her weekday trips to the local senior center for games and camaraderie with friends.

The video became a sensation because it so touchingly captures the challenges of advancing age, particularly the struggle with loneliness. Living by herself without family nearby, Tony has found a novel way to keep busy. "You know what I do? Don't laugh," she says. "I get junk mail, I strip it. And after I strip it, I cut it up small, put it in a bag and put it for garbage." She adds, "I have to do something; otherwise, I'd go nuts."

HOLIDAY BLUES

While her advanced age sets her apart, Tony's living situation is not unusual today. According to a 2012 study by the Department of Health and Human Services, 46 percent of non-institutionalized women over the age of 75 live alone - and the percentage increases with age. The Christmas season is especially hard for those who associate the holidays with happier times earlier in their lives, perhaps with loved ones who are deceased. Catching the holiday blues, together with colder winter weather, causes some seniors to avoid activities with other people, further isolating and depressing them.

OUR THROWAWAY CULTURE

In the prayer book he uses daily, Pope Francis keeps a letter composed for his ordination by the grandmother who helped raise him. It reminds the pope that the elderly are "a storehouse of wisdom forged by experience." But even though "life has been lengthened" by advancements in medicine, he reflects, "society has not become more open to life." Instead, in a "society organized around efficiency," we are tempted to ignore those who move slowly. "There is something vile in this addiction to the throwaway culture," he insists. "It's awful to see the elderly discarded . . . It's a sin!"

PASTORAL CARE

Pope Francis strongly encourages Catholics to counteract society's indifference to the elderly and homebound. Here at Lourdes we do that in an organized way through our 10-member Pastoral Care Team. In response to requests to our clergy or church office, team members visit and pray with the sick and shut-in, including elderly members who can no longer attend services regularly. These short visits, around 15 in a typical week, supplement our individual visits to the homebound in our own families or in our wider church family . . . if we don't put those visits off or forget them altogether.

A call or visit can make a world of difference to those who are elderly or shut-in. At the close of the video about Mary Tony, workers from her senior center stop by to chat with her and help her with a few chores. It is her first company in a long time. "I love you all for coming," Tony tearfully tells them. "It's made my day, and I'll never forget it."
