

The old adage "Hard cases make bad law" was well illustrated in the case of Charlie Gard, the 11-month-old British baby hospitalized for a rare genetic condition which left him unable to move, eat, or breathe without assistance. Concluding that further treatment would prove futile and inflict additional suffering, his medical team decided to withdraw his life support so he could "die with dignity." His heartbroken parents raised nearly \$2 million on GoFundMe to bring him to the US for an experimental treatment, but both British and European courts overruled their wishes.

The international debate which followed included not only medical experts and ethicists but celebrities and politicians—and created unusual alliances on both sides. Amid clashes over issues ranging from government health care to parental rights, it was easy to lose focus on the struggling child and those who loved him best.

RESPECTING LIFE AND ACCEPTING DEATH

As Britain's Anscombe Bioethics Centre pointed out, Catholic teaching on end-of-life care forbids efforts to bring about or hasten death. We are obliged to use all ordinary means of sustaining life, those in which anticipated benefits outweigh likely risks. However, our "Catholic moral tradition does not oblige the use of medical procedures that are burdensome, dangerous, extraordinary, or disproportionate to their expected outcome." In such cases, we recognize that "[t]here is a time to fight and a time to cease from fighting" and accept the reality of our own mortality and that of our loved ones.

In line with that teaching, the Pontifical Academy for Life agreed that it was time to "accept the limits of medicine" and urged that Charlie's parents "be helped to understand the unique difficulty of their situation." Critics called that statement cold and unfeeling.

"REALITY IS SUPERIOR TO IDEAS"

Just hours after his Vatican officials had spoken, however, Pope Francis weighed in on Twitter with the differently toned message posted above, and his spokesman added the hashtag #CharlieGard. Offers of help from the Vatican's own children's hospital soon followed. This pastoral intervention illustrated another old adage, one that has often guided the pope's reflections on moral theology: "Reality is superior to ideas."

Convinced that we can discern the will of God not by abstract reasoning alone but by sympathetic engagement with those enduring life's harsh realities. Pope Francis urges Catholics to focus on the human side of even our most difficult moral dilemmas. For that reason, he expressed his "closeness" with little Charlie's parents, "wishing that their desire to accompany and care for their own child to the end will be respected."
