For 30 years, Mark Ji Tianxiang, a 19th century Chinese layman, was denied the sacraments. Repeatedly he had confessed his reliance on opium to his parish priest, but he could not shake his addiction. Concluding that he was not truly repentant, the priest finally told him he could no longer receive communion. Yet Tianxiang quietly maintained his Catholic faith, and when Chinese authorities ordered him to renounce it, he chose martyrdom instead, singing a litany to Mary as he was taken away.

When Tianxiang was executed in 1900, substance abuse was considered scandalous as well as sinful. A century later, when Pope John Paul canonized St. Mark Ji Tianxiang, Catholics had come to recognize addiction as a crisis of public health whose victims need compassionate care directed toward their eventual recovery.

DEADLY PAINKILLERS

The opium dens of Chinese history flourished as sick people sought relief from pain. In the United States, medically-effective opioid pain killers (like codeine, morphine, and oxycodone) have proven habit-forming for some patients long after the maladies for which they were prescribed have passed. People who become addicted may then turn to illegally-obtained pain pills, to heroin (also an opiate), or to methamphetamine or cocales, two stimulants increasingly used in combination with opiates.

In the past year, reports Georgia Health News, 11 million Americans misused opioid pain relieves, and more than 21 million suffered from an opioid use disorder. The results can be deadly. In 2016, Georgia had at least 1,394 deaths related to drug overdoses, primarily from opioids and heroin, though meth-related deaths are also accelerating. Sadly, American life expectancy is now falling, with the poor hit the hardest.


