Dear Lourdes Family:

Most of us tend to think that the straight path is the best one. As we reflect on the journey that Lourdes has traveled over the last ten years, however, our path for much-needed parking and expansion has been anything but straight.

As we begin implementing the vision of building a new church, we have summarized some of the milestones of our journey.


- In 2008, Lourdes purchased the land on Edgewood (currently our parking lot) with the plan and intention to build a new church on the property.
- In 2013, Lourdes purchased the Centennial Property (on Boulevard, less than a block south of Lourdes). With nearby land in short supply, this was a perfect opportunity to acquire what we needed to be able to develop needed parking and move forward with the plans to build a new church on Edgewood.
- In 2015, neighborhood groups and the City of Atlanta required Lourdes plans to accommodate a parking structure with liner buildings (buildings around the perimeter of the parking area). There was also resistance to building a parking garage above ground level, so we were required to have a garage below ground level.
- Because we had no intention of becoming a retail and/or housing landlord, we embarked on the path to find a developer. We took our time to find the one that would serve our needs with assurances to protect our investment. In 2018 we sold the Centennial property to Lucror Resources to build a mixed-use development. We were able to use the sale of the land as leverage to gain additional parking spaces we need.
- Our current Edgewood lot has capacity for approximately 100 cars. In the parking structure to be built by Lucror, we will gain 200 parking spaces for Saturday evenings and Sundays and nearly double our total parking capacity. The agreement guarantees parking for Lourdes in perpetuity.

We offer our sincere gratitude to our parish family. We have taken a number of steps forward in faith as we launch into the next chapter in our history and our mission in Jesus Christ. We ask for your prayers and your continued support as we move forward into the future.




