Vincent Lambert, 42, is a French nurse who was left quadriplegic and brain damaged in a motorcycle accident in 2008. Though Lambert breathes on his own and can open and move his eyes, his wife and some of his siblings insist that he has shown no signs of consciousness and should be heavily sedated and allowed to die of starvation. His parents, devout Catholics, have insisted that their son is not terminally ill and appealed to French courts and international agencies to save his life.

The case of the "French Terri Schiavo," as Lambert is known, has divided public opinion in France and abroad, with French socialists demanding legalized euthanasia and conservative critics warning of likely abuses. All parties recognize that the underlying issues are not medical but ethical and moral. In an op-ed in the newspaper Le Monde, clinicians who care for the cognitively disabled declared that "to judge that their life is not dignified or 'makes no sense', is neither ethical nor scientifically justifiable."

## IS VINCENT LAMBERT A PERSON?

Lambert's parents bought some time for their son with a successful appeal to the UN "Committee on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities." But that appeal itself raised a divisive question: Is Vincent Lambert really a "person"? In Christian anthropology, personhood and the rights that accompany it are gifts from God, in whose image we are made at conception. Personhood is inviolable and cannot be forfeited. But today it is more common to see individuals as self-made and to regard personhood as a status that is achieved at (or even after) birth—a status that can be lost before death.

The editor-in-chief of an academic journal in bioethics put it starkly: "Not all humans are persons. Fetuses, infants, the profoundly mentally retarded and the hopelessly comatose provide examples of human non-persons. They are members of the human species but do not in and of themselves have standing in the secular moral community." This is the rationale used to justify abortion and infanticide as well as ending the lives of people with dementia and profound cognitive disabilities.

## "THE DIRTY WORK OF DEATH"

Addressing the Pontifical Academy for Life last June, Pope Francis called for a "global vision of bioethics" which recognizes that every human life makes sense. From conception, he said, every life, even when "fragile and sick, wounded, offended, demoralized, marginalized and those cast aside" is "always human life." and to reject "the inviolable dignity of the human person" is to do "the dirty work of death."

Of Vincent Lambert himself, Pope Francis insists, "Let us always safeguard life, God's gift, from its beginning until its natural end. Let us not give in to a throwaway culture."
