

For the entrance procession, the crossbearer accompanied by a candle bearer, the leader, and those representing Jesus, two members of the Sanhedrin, a Roman soldier, a bystander, a companion, Simon of Cyrene, Veronica, a woman of Jerusalem, and Joseph of Arimathea enter together in silence.

All bow to the cross and proceed to their stations.

During the way of the cross, the cross and candle bearers alone highlight the fourteen stations. All others read from their place in the sanctuary.

For the recessional, the cross and candle bearer return to the sanctuary. All bow to the cross and exit in silence as they entered.
